Report on key activities January 2015 – July 2017

The Centre for Sustainable Business at SSE Riga (CSB) was founded in 2012 thanks to the generous financial support of SEB. The key aim of the CSB is to foster a discussion on sustainability both in the business community and in society in general. The Centre consists of its director, Dr Arnis Sauka, Assistant Professor Dr Xavier Landes (recruited in fall 2016) and Project Manager Liene Sandalāne. A number of other researchers representing academic institutions and NGOs are involved in the activities of the CSB on an ad-hoc basis.

To raise awareness of sustainability, the CSB, in cooperation with its partners, provides research, teaching and training and contributes actively to public debate. This report summarises key activities within the Centre for Sustainable Business at SSE Riga from January 2015-July 2017.

1. Teaching

Ethics and Sustainable Business Course (bachelor's level)

The Ethics and Sustainable Business course at SSE Riga was launched on November 26, 2012, and continued from 2013-2015. Each year this course has gathered more than 130 students and 16 companies for joint learning experiences in the fields of sustainability and CSR. The course was run by a team of SSE Riga and visiting lecturers, including Dr Roberts Ķīlis, Dr Arnis Sauka, Dr Karen Wilson and Dr Thomas Eggert. Since September 2016, Dr Xavier Landes has been involved in further developing the course and acted as a course director. This has resulted in further development of the course, drawing on an in-depth literature review on climate change. Dr Landes has also actively applied for funding and has already built an international network (involving the University of Copenhagen, McGill University, and Université Catholique de Louvain) to benefit course participants.

Ethics and Sustainable Business Course for the EMBA

The first sustainable business course for the EMBA in which the Centre was involved took place in Sweden in 2013; EMBA students got acquainted with best practice sustainability examples at TeliaSonera and other Swedish companies. The theoretical background for

the course was provided by lecturer Dr Hans De Geer. Since then, the CSB has been involved in elaborating on training content for an executive and corporate public, e.g. with the Swedish Institute in October 2016.

Other teaching activities

Dr Xavier Landes has contributed to other courses at SSE Riga, such as the EMBA Programme, Organisation and Management and Research Methods. He has also taught at various institutions such as Stradins University, Turiba University and the French Lycée, further promoting the concept of sustainability to a wider audience.

In spring 2016 Dr Arnis Sauka ran the PhD-level course 'New Scientist Lab: Advancing Skills for Developing a Doctoral Thesis' (3 ECTS, B level), while in fall 2016 he ran the PhD-level course 'How to Write an Academic Article' (4.5 ECTS, B level). This teaching is part of the Centre's activity to promote excellence within the academic environment of Latvia, involving sustainability and ethics in academic writing. The course is run within the framework of a cooperation agreement with SSE Riga, RISEBA University and BA School of Business and Finance, PhD Programme in Business Management. Arnis Sauka has also held guest lectures in SSE Riga courses such as Organisations and Management (BSc) and Research Methods (BSc and EMBA).

Bachelor's and EMBA Theses

From 2015 to 2017, CSB members have supervised and evaluated numerous theses on topics such as fiscal morale, the shadow economy, corporate social responsibility, and human rights violation scandals. By doing so, they contribute to the diversity of skills nurtured at SSE Riga and to training responsible future leaders.

2. Research: publications

To understand the business environment in terms of sustainable (as well as unsustainable) business practices, there is a need to undertake research on two levels: *theoretical*, about the economic, political and ethical dimensions of sustainability and business ethics, and *applied* – in both the Baltic context and beyond. CSB staff is actively involved in organising, moderating and presenting at various academic events, including:

The SSE Riga Open Workshops Series

The Open Workshop Series in Business and Management Studies aims to promote topquality academic and applied research in various fields of the social sciences. The main target audience includes doctoral students and more senior scholars interested in recent developments in conceptual frameworks as well as methodologies to address entrepreneurship and management challenges, providing a platform for sharing knowledge and networking with the local and international community. Some of the seminars are devoted to sustainability issues, broadly defined. Open Workshops are offered to PhD students as a PhD level course, 'Contemporary Entrepreneurship Research'. On average, 25 participants attend the course, mostly PhD students from various universities in Latvia, including the University of Latvia, Riga Technical University, BA School of Business and Finance, and RISEBA University. Also, more senior academics as well as practitioners attend the workshops. Workshops are moderated by Arnis Sauka. They are free of charge for participants and run in English. The list of Open Workshops held from January 2015-July 2017 can be found in Appendix 1.

NCSB 2016

The 19th Nordic Conference on Small Business and Entrepreneurship (NCSB 2016) was held in Riga in May 2016, organized by the CSB at SSE Riga. The conference has been run since 1980. Recognizing the role of entrepreneurship and small business in both regional and national contexts, the main focus of the conference in 2016 was "Entrepreneurship and Value Creation". Approximately 60 papers were presented during the conference by scholars representing universities and business schools across Europe and beyond. Dr Arnis Sauka also organised and moderated the pre-doctoral conference, attended by 15 doctoral students.

Conference on Entrepreneurship, Innovativeness and Regional Development: EIRD 2015-2017

This conference was first run in July 2013, aiming to bring together leading researchers from the universities and business schools in Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia, and beyond, in discussing sustainable and non-sustainable business practices in the Baltic countries. This is an initiative of the SSE Riga CSB, working in close cooperation with Tartu University, Tallinn University of Technology (Estonia), ISM Business School (Lithuania) and Ventspils University College (Latvia). The first conference was hosted by Ventspils University College with more than 60 participants from the Baltic states, Scandinavian countries, the UK, Turkey, Germany, Finland, Russia and Belarus. The 5th conference: Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Regional Development – EIRD 2017 was held in June 2017 at Ventspils University College, Ventspils, Latvia. The 4th EIRD was held at the Tallinn School of Economics and Business Administration, Tallinn, Estonia in June 2016, while the 3rd EIRD took place at ISM in Vilnius, Lithuania in September 2015.

ASBBMC 2015-2017

SSE Riga has been involved in co-organising ASBBMC (Annual Scientific Baltic Business Management Conference) since 2015 together with BA School of Business and Finance and RISEBA University. The main aim of this co-operation is to further strengthen ties with the local community of researchers in entrepreneurship and business administration. The most recent ASBBMC was held in Riga at RISEBA University in April 2017. Dr Arnis Sauka also organized and moderated the pre-doctoral conference for ASBBMC. http://www.riseba.lv/en/asbbmc-2017-call-papers 15 PhD students from various universities in Latvia attended.

3.4. Policy debate

An integral part of the Centre's activities is to raise awareness of sustainable business. This involves an active communication strategy, including events such as open lectures and seminars, workshops, guest lectures, roundtables, and media activities.

SSE Riga Shadow Economy Index and Conference on the Shadow Economy

The aim of the SSE Riga Shadow Economy Index for the Baltic Countries is to measure the size of the shadow economies in Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia as well as to explore the main factors that influence participation in the shadow economy. SEB generously supported the Index during the period of 2012-2016. The SSE Riga Shadow Economy Index for the Baltic Countries has been presented annually since 2010 at a mid-May conference organized in cooperation with the Latvian Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Ministry of Finance of Latvia. Recent conferences were held in 2015 and 2016 and for the 7th time in 2017, attracting major interest from national media in each Baltic country. For example, as summarized by Latvian News Agency, there were 347 unique articles / TV and

radio broadcasts in the Latvian national media from May 12, 2016-June 12, 2016 – one month after the conference in 2016. The media reports on the Index extensively throughout the year. The conference attracts major interest from policymakers, e.g. the 2017 conference was opened by the Prime Minister of Latvia, while the Minister of Economics as well as the Head of the State Revenue Service are often speakers at the conference. The Index is used extensively by the Ministry of Finance of Latvia, the Ministry of Economics of Latvia, the Estonian Tax and Customs Board, and various associations and NGOs in the Baltic countries.

The Shadow Economy in the Construction Industry in Latvia: Study and Conference

The SSE Riga CSB, in cooperation with the NGO BASE (Business against the Shadow Economy) and the Partnership of Latvian Construction Entrepreneurs, has launched a study on the size and determinants of the shadow economy in the construction industry. The study involves a quantitative survey and an expert interview to analyse key challenges and provide policy suggestions to reduce the shadow economy and increase the competitiveness of the construction industry in Latvia. Two conferences – in 2015 and 2016 – have been held where Dr Arnis Sauka presented the findings of the study. The Prime Minister, the Minister of Economics and representatives of major NGOs as well as the main construction industries attended the conference in 2015 and 2016 and the results were discussed extensively with the wider public via mass media.

FICIL Sentiment Index and conferences on the foreign direct investment climate in Latvia

The FICIL Sentiment Index was established in 2015 by the Foreign Investors' Council in Latvia (FICIL), developed by Dr Arnis Sauka from the CSB. The key aim of the Index is to foster more evidence-based policy decisions to further promote a favourable investment climate in Latvia. We aim to achieve this by summarising the key concerns and suggestions of the main foreign investors in Latvia – representatives of companies that have made the decision to invest in the country and have been operating here for a considerable time period.

This study has resulted in 2 reports and conferences. The key aim of the study / report presented in 2016 was to explore whether, according to foreign investors in Latvia, there has been any progress in the development of the investment climate in Latvia. In particular:

- Do investors see progress with regard to the policy initiatives to meet the main challenges identified in the 2015 study?
- What has been done and what still remains to be done (according to foreign investors in Latvia) to improve the investment climate in Latvia?
- Are there any new (emerging) challenges that policymakers should be aware of? As in 2015, the FICIL Sentiment Index 2016 draws on a survey mini case studies of foreign investors in Latvia. From September to the beginning of October 2016 we interviewed the same 24 companies that took part in the 2015 study. In addition, 8 new companies took part in the 2016 study; thus, in total, 32 foreign investors in Latvia participated in the 2016 study. Altogether, these companies represent more than 30% of the total foreign direct

investment in Latvia and contribute to more than 10% of Latvia's total tax revenue.

Both reports were presented by Dr Arnis Sauka at conferences organised in cooperation with FICIL. The conferences were attended by key policymakers in Latvia, including ministers, officials, ambassadors and foreign direct investors. A wider audience has been introduced with the contents of the report via mass media.

'Should We Care about Happiness?' LAMPA Festival, Cesis, July 2017

This roundtable addressed the potential and limits of happiness research for citizens, corporations and governments. The panellists were Meik Wiking, Director of the Happiness Research Institute (Denmark), Ivars Ijabs, Professor at the University of Latvia, and Xavier Landes, Professor at SSE Riga.

Pensi-Meter

The Centre for Sustainable Business at SSE Riga, in cooperation with SEB, has carried out research to determine the awareness of Latvians, Lithuanians and Estonians about the pension system and how they are preparing for retirement. The 'Pensi-Meter' research discloses that the readiness of residents of the Baltic states for retirement, in aggregate, can be assessed as low. Employees in Latvia are the least ready for retirement compared to residents of the other Baltic states. This is the first research of its kind; residents of the Baltic states provided their opinion in in-depth interviews, characterising the level of readiness of the population for old age and receiving a pension in the future.

The Pensi-Meter was first launched in 2015 and presented by Dr Arnis Sauka at a press conference. SEB also repeated the study in 2016. The study attracted substantial media coverage in all three Baltic countries.

CSB Public Lectures and Workshops

The CSB has also organized public lectures on topical themes, including: Jurgen de Wispelaere (University of Bath), 'What (If Anything) Can We Learn from Piloting Basic Income Experiments?', April 7th, 2017

Experts on exports

The CSB organized the 'experts on exports' discussion in April 2015, in cooperation with the Latvian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, with the participation of:

3.5. Media Activities

Activities implemented by the Centre for Sustainable Business (such as the Shadow Economy Index, shadow economy research in the construction industry, the FICIL Sentiment Index) have been widely discussed by national media, mostly in Latvia but also

in Estonia and Lithuania. Researchers of the Centre comment on topics related to competitiveness, sustainability and ethics on a regular basis.
